FROM THE PASTOR:



Congratulations to our eighth graders who last Sunday received the sacrament of Confirmation from Bishop Thomas! It was a wonderful celebration in St. Peter's church, made possible by all three of our parishes working together with lectoring, serving, singing, etc. Bishop Thomas also commented on how beautiful it was to see the unity and mutual

appreciation among the different parishes present.

Bishop Thomas also commented on how well the students were prepared for the sacrament. Many thanks go to both their catechists and their parents for helping our young people to know and love the Faith Jesus has given us. The students have studied the gifts of the Holy Spirit and learned how they help them become mature Christians. They learned they received these gifts at Baptism and how each is strengthened through Confirmation. The purpose is for them to truly live the Catholic Faith as the Saints did!

The eighth graders devoted this past year to preparing for the sacrament. They came to understand that receiving this sacrament does not make them "an adult of the Church" nor is it them "making the Faith their own". These statements are said by well-meaning people who do not understand the purpose of Confirmation. The word "Con-firm-ation" tells us something about its purpose. If you know any Spanish, which has similarities to Latin, then you probably know that "con" means "with". From this we begin to understand that the sacrament is meant to help us be "firm" (strong) in living the Faith of the Church.

The reason why Confirmation is not about "making the Faith their own" is that they have been doing this and will (hopefully) continue to do this for their entire lives. Receiving the sacrament of Confirmation gives them the necessary grace to live more and more according to all that God has taught us. Those who do so are growing in Christian maturity, which is a requirement for entering into heaven, as we read in the New Testament.

Maturity is not measured by age but instead by the qualities and characteristics of a person. As a result, Confirmation does not make a person an adult of the Church but gives them the grace to become fully mature. God's help is always near! In my conversations with the students, we talked about how a mature Christian is someone who prays daily and keeps holy the Lord's day each Sunday, which includes going to Mass. A mature Christian does not use God's name in vain and does not use vulgar language. We talked about how some words that are common today would never come from a mature Christian's mouth.

We also discussed how a mature Christian does not lie, cheat, or steal. The mature Christian is charitable to other people and tries to lead them closer to God. Such a person forgives others and even prays for those who are uncharitable to him/herself. The mature Christian does not follow the trends of society but instead the will of God. That person treats sexuality as sacred and does not give in to sinful sexual desires, and respects life at every stage.

We give thanks for our priests, volunteers, and visitors to Richland Correctional. Our RiCl Catholic community is filled with




gratitude and joy for our many blessings - and for the extraordinary opportunity to gather daily for worship, prayer, music, fellowship, and more.

PARENT EDUCATIONAL FREEDOM ACT

Senate Bill 11, called the "Parent Educational Freedom Act," will expand eligibility for Educational Choice scholarships (EdChoice) to all students in Ohio beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. It would provide to parents for each pupil up to \$5,500 for grades K-8, and \$7,500 for grades 9-12. It also increases the amount of homeschooling expenses that a taxpayer can claim as an income tax credit each year, from \$250 to \$2,000. CHRIST REMAINS PRESENT

A powerful thread of truth runs through each of today's Easter season readings: Jesus resurrected. "God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses," (Acts 2:32). The Apostles testified to this raising of Jesus, but also, and maybe even more powerful, is the testimony of those who did not want this truth to be known. Scholars often refer to the latter as "hostile witnesses." People who could not deny what they saw but did not wish to perpetuate the following of Christ become witnesses to the majesty of God. It's fascinating how differently the world perceives the history of secular nature from that of religion. We possess many history books filled with events, teachings, and speeches; we do not doubt nor question; we trust what was seen and recorded is accurate. And it is taught from generation to generation.

Yet how few believe "God raised this Jesus." The Resurrection opened heaven to those, "who through him believe in God who raised him from the dead and gave him glory so that your faith and hope are in God." St. Peter reminds us to hold fast to this truth so that our hope and faith remain with God. The testimony of those who saw, spoke, and ate with the Risen Lord provides us a confident hope in the Good News. No one but One ever claimed to be the Son of God and then rose from the dead. Two thousand years later we are still speaking of his salvific work upon the cross; still re-presenting those moments upon altars across the world; still worshiping and singing praises.

The 24th Chapter of Luke's Gospel includes the Walk to Emmaus. Jesus journeyed alongside those disciples, but they did not recognize him. He is still with us today, a true and ever-present companion. How often do we fail to recognize Jesus in our midst? In the Emmaus encounter, in the breaking of bread, "their eyes were opened and they recognized him," (Luke 24:31). Jesus offers the faithful that same wondrous opportunity at each and every Mass to be present at the blessing and breaking of the bread.

When the disciples encountered Jesus on the road, they urged him to stay with them. Through God's mysterious, remarkable workings, which we will never comprehend this side of heaven, Jesus remains with us still at every Consecration, in every Tabernacle, and within the hearts of those who receive him in the Eucharist.
