HEAD OF SCHOOL UPDATE

We are just days away from the end of another school year. It's been a year full of new initiatives and progress made in many areas. I'm excited to update you on all the great things happening at St. Peter's.

Here is a look at what we've accomplished this year:

- Math scores have improved and, equally important, we are better able to hone in on the specific content areas and students that need the greatest focus moving forward.
- We've collected critical baseline data for every student in our school that is being leveraged in everything from course offerings to individual interventions to career planning.
- We are the only school in the area that has tested every student for our gifted and talented program. Also, every 10th grader took the ACT this spring, and every 7th, 8th, and 9th grader took the pACT. These tests provided a wealth of data to help prepare students for the next level. A higher ACT score could mean thousands in additional scholarship dollars for our students.
- Our commitment to Theology and student formation has renewed and increased the spirituality of our students, staff, and school, emphasizing the depth, breadth, beauty, and humanity of our Catholic faith.

Our work here at St. Peter's is only the beginning. We have several new initiatives planned for next year. The biggest initiative is the launch of St. Peter's Middle School.

After several months of studying research, exploring best practices, reviewing student data, assessing student behaviors, dialoguing with the staff, and analyzing resources, we are excited to announce a dedicated, selfcontained Middle School for grades 6, 7, and 8 on the third floor of the high school building.

The new middle school will include several refreshed classrooms, a science lab, homework space, an honors lounge, a community meeting space, and, most importantly, a dedicated core of teachers committed to working with this age group. This program will feature an enhanced curriculum that will allow for both remediation and honors courses (including Latin) and focus on building the habits, skills, and behaviors that lead to lifelong success.

Our work here at St. Peter's School is only beginning. There is a renewed energy and spirit – among our faculty and staff, students, and parents. Enrollment trends are positive, with many new prospective families touring our school. Thank you for your prayers and financial support. You, our parishioners, are a key part of St. Peter's history, legacy, and future. As members of St. Peter's family, we hope you continue to bless us with your generosity.

Last week, we celebrated the creative and musical talents of our students at ArtFest.





HELP PROTECT THE DIGNITY OF LIFE IN OHIO

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that "human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception." The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. The following materials about the proposed amendment are available:
