#### **Editor's Note:**

Unfortunately, the previous issue of our Sunday Bulletin (both in print and online) for last week, October 1, contained several errors. The Editor wishes to apologize to you and assure you that we will continue to strive for excellence in the production of this publication.

(In the meantime, we're planning on blaming the new guy who took on the bulletin earlier this summer! He seems a likely fallguy.)



In our scripture readings this weekend, both from the prophet Isaiah and the Gospel of Matthew, we hear of the landowner with the vineyard. In each of these God is showing us the path to the fullness of life. As each of us knows, there are many distractions and temptations in this world that lead us off the path to the kingdom of God, which we call heaven. God knows this and so He

speaks to us, giving us inspiration and instruction to return to the pathway of heaven.

In the gospel, one of the points that Jesus makes is that physical violence and abuse of other people is completely contrary to who God is, and therefore everything that God has taught us. Jesus says, to His own astonishment, that people even close off their minds and hearts to good, collaborating with evil, to murder another person. Jesus makes clear in the Gospel that such actions are not the pathway to heaven but to eternal misery and self-inflicted punishment. Jesus gives us this parable because He wants none to perish, but all to have eternal life (cf. John 3:16). Jesus gives His life in order that we might have life.

In the first scripture reading, the prophet Isaiah wants us to reflect on why the vineyard is producing wild grapes instead of good grapes. God created the world good, overflowing with life, but our misuse of freedom has brought death upon us. So often our misuse of freedom is related to pride and selfishness. We were reminded at Mass last week "to have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus." In the same second reading, we were told to "do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory, rather humbly regard others as more important than yourselves."

Ohioans will decide in four weeks whether it is permissible to commit acts of violence and abuse against the most vulnerable in our society. We will decide if these should be written into our Constitution through issue 1. That proposed constitutional change would legalize and protect what King Herod did at Jesus' birth - the mass killing of the Innocent. People of decency and common sense rejected that evil then and we should still reject that evil today.

Going back to our scripture readings this weekend, we are told that the wild grapes are the work of the enemy, who is named Satan. Jesus says those who commit acts of violence and murder against the innocent are wicked and in need of conversion. Let us assist them in their conversion with fervent prayers and regular fasting, especially each Friday as we recall Jesus sacrificing Himself that others may have life.

On the topic of abortion, Pope Francis recently warned us not "to be poisoned by the toxins of selfishness, individualism, and indifference." St. Teresa of Calcutta said "any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love but to use any violence to get what it wants." Violence and death are never the answer if a good outcome is desired. Please pray, fast, and work for the conversion of those who support abortion in any way.

## PRISON MINISTRY CORNER





Prison ministry has been an important part of our parish life for nearly 125 years! Fr. Ferdinand Schreiber became St. Peter's Pastor in 1898 and began ministering to the prison community at the Ohio State Reformatory on Olivesburg Road in 1899. When it opened, the Reformatory was the largest prison in the state and one of the largest in the country. It was touted as a shining example of effective rehabilitation programming. Younger, non-violent or first-time offenders made up the majority of the Reformatory's population. Fr. Schreiber's concern was genuine and compassionate. Our Parish Sacramental records are full of notations about immates celebrated the Sacraments.

## FROM MR. NATHAN SIMS, DIRECTOR OF THEOLOGY AND STUDENT FORMATION

Starting a school year is interesting because you begin the year with many goals and wonder how successful and how many of these goals will be accomplished. But with the start of the year many great advancements have been made. I generally break up my strategic development into three categories: intellectual development, spiritual development, and physical development. We have had great developments in each of these categories which you will see below.

## **Intellectual Development**

On the intellectual side of things we have been pushing our students to work with difficult content. Through the development of a new theology curriculum which relies upon reading of direct sources and a philosophical depth, the students are beginning to contemplate important topics that challenge our culture's understanding of living well. The addition of Mikayla Metzger as our theology teacher in the middle school has been a big win. Her depth of education and seriousness in the faith has been a blessing and she is quickly becoming a core component of Catholic Identity for St. Peters. I have come to see that the vast majority of our students desire to develop a strong intellect and are not afraid of addressing difficult questions about God, life, and purpose. I work to develop a curriculum that allows students to partake in the rigors of true education while also forming their way of thinking to bring them closer to God.

#### Spiritual Development

The spiritual development has made leaps and bounds this year. To begin, Fr. Kevin is now present, nearly daily, in the high school and middle school. I cannot say enough about what that has done to strengthen our identity as a Catholic school. His presence is necessary and he is now able to work with students in the difficulties of their life. We have received the most amount of volunteers to become servers than at any time in the past. I credit this to Fr. Kevin's presence. Fr. Kevin, in the school, has also taken to teaching on Spiritual Formation Thursdays, which the students have become very fond of. Beyond this we are now planning retreats for the elementary school, which has not been done in the past. We have also had a group of students express interest in joining the Catholic Church. By working with Fr. Miller and the other priests, we have now been able to offer the students formation through their year at St. Peter's with the intention of them becoming confirmed this Easter.

#### **Physical Development**

The physical development of the students has taken some interesting but beneficial turns. We are rethinking our service program, and this will be incorporated into the high school and middle school soon. We are shifting the focus from the number of



## POPE SAINT JOHN XXIII (1881 - 1963) FEAST DAY - OCTOBER 11



Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was an ordinary man who achieved extraordinary things in the 20th century. Born into a farming family in northern Italy, he joined the Secular Franciscan order and served in Rome in various capacities following his ordination.

During World War II, his diplomacy helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people. He was named a cardinal in 1953, and later elected pope, taking the name John after his father and St. John Lateran. Pope John soon became famous for his wit and he began meeting with world political and religious leaders. His writings include "Mother and Teacher" (1961) and "Peace on Earth" (1963). He enlarged the College of Cardinals, making it more international. He opened the Second Vatican Council and set the tone for it stating "...the Spouse of Christ prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than



that of severity." He is nicknamed "Good Pope John". May Pope Saint John XXIII encourage us by his teachings and example, to understand the Gospel better and to understand each other better. -Tami Urcia
