From the Athletic Director

November has been a busy month for our athletic program. In addition to the celebration of our fall athletes at the end of their season, we have been working with our coaches at all levels to prepare for our winter sports. St. Peter's School has a long legacy of successful athletic teams, and we are working hard to ensure that tradition continues. As you will see, we are showing positive growth in many areas while developing longterm plans to increase involvement in other areas. We are investing in programs at the elementary level to promote long-term growth of the program and offer opportunities for girls to play youth basketball. Thanks to elementary parent Joe Mulherin, St. Peter's is fielding two co-ed basketball teams at the Mansfield YMCA this winter. These two teams (1st/2nd grades and 3rd/4th grades) practice on campus and are able to use the FAC weekly to experience playing in the high school gym.

Additionally, our varsity girls basketball coaches have been working with all the area private schools to offer playing opportunities in an all-girls elementary basketball league this winter. Plus, we will offer open gyms to our middle school and high school girls in the spring and summer, so those interested have the chance to improve and practice with other Lady Spartans. Our largest areas of positive growth this winter are in our middle school and high school boys basketball programs. For the first time in three years, St. Peter's High School will have full JV and varsity boys basketball teams. Each team will have a complete schedule, and they will play their Mid-Buckeye Conference games on Friday nights during the season. The JV team will also participate in a holiday tournament sponsored by Gilead Christian School in late December.

Our middle school boys basketball program is also growing, and we will have separate 7th and 8th grade teams. In addition to their regularly scheduled conference games, our middle school teams will have two new opportunities this season. First, with the help of an 8th grade parent, we will be hosting St. Bridget of

Kildare, another Catholic School from Dublin. Plus, our 8th grade team may have the chance to compete in a "Middle School Showcase" at Mansfield Senior in January. Thank you to Coach Windom for helping our athletes and program grow.

Our high school bowling program is ready for the season under the direction of their new head coach, Mr. Son Wynn. He brings excitement and energy to the teams, and his enthusiasm has the bowlers motivated for their upcoming matches and tournaments. We will have full boys and girls teams this season, and we are looking forward to all the first-time bowlers joining our experienced bowlers.

St. Peter's is also fortunate to be able to offer indoor track during the winter season. Bruce Woodson, our track coach, is kind enough to provide this opportunity to athletes interested in preparing for their outdoor track season in the spring. We have multiple middle school and high school students who plan to participate in the weekend meets at the indoor track facilities of various colleges throughout Ohio.

Coach Amanda Windom will once again have a strong group of girls participating on our high school and middle school cheer squads this winter. At every game they attend, our cheerleaders bring an unparalleled level of spirit and are the most positive, vocal supporters of our basketball teams. The athletic department receives compliments regularly from our opponents and their fans in support of how dedicated our cheerleaders are each season. Thanks to a generous donation from Mr. Son Wynn, our high school cheer squads will once again have a Spartan Mascot present at our games, and he will be an integral part of their program.

Our athletic programs would not be possible without the help of our Spartan Athletics Booster Club. They provided new girls basketball uniforms and practice jerseys last year. This year they have provided warmup jackets for all our middle school athletes, and they have purchased brand new uniforms for our middle school and high school boys basketball teams. They are always looking for motivated parents who want to be more involved in their child's athletic experiences here at St. Peter's, so if you are interested in joining the Boosters, please contact our athletic director.

With all the students involved, St. Peter's actually has more athletes (both high school and middle school) participating in a winter sport than we have had each of the past three years. As you can see, we are trending in a positive direction, and the athletic department plans to do everything possible to promote these teams and our athletes this winter. We encourage you to also show your support - attend their games, cheer for them, offer your time as a volunteer at athletic events, and share all the great things our athletes will do during the winter 2023-2024 season.
