#### FROM THE PASTOR:



Last week was a great blessing for our parishes! The timing was nearly perfect for having Bishop Thomas and Fr. Hayes with us, leading us in prayer and sharing their spiritual insights. This is because it coincided with the midpoint of Lent, which is the time many people struggle with their Lenten prayer and penance. Some people have the best of intentions for Lent but struggle

after the first few days. This past week helped to motivate and inspire not just those people, but all who attended.

Besides the spiritual talks, I was especially grateful for the singers and musicians from all three parishes working together as a single group. Their singing Sunday afternoon was as good as any church or cathedral that I have experienced! Their working together was as beautiful for me as their singing. Jesus prayed that we all might be one and I saw that in the choir loft and in the pews, which were nearly full! We priests heard many confessions, and that too was a great blessing!

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is one of the most important sacraments that Jesus gave us. That is the first sacrament Jesus gave to the Apostles after His resurrection from the dead. Jesus began the work of reconciling us to one another and to the Father, and then directs the apostles to continue doing that through the confessional. We priests are joyful for every person who comes to this important sacrament. We are eager to do the work of God in forgiving their sins, assisting them spiritually, and providing the grace they need to overcome their faults and weaknesses.

To help with your preparation for going to Confession, you will find included within this bulletin a list of self-reflective questions. These questions are meant to help each person know their sins, or said differently, to know the ways we do not love God and neighbor as we should. The questions help us to know what we need to bring to the Sacrament of Confession. Like any good coach, they point out to each of us, for our own good, where spiritual growth and maturity is needed.

Pope Francis encourages us to visit the confessional so that we are better equipped for "hand-to-hand combat" with Satan. Pope Francis said that we need to "teach our children, our youngsters to make a good confession, because going to Confession is not like going to the dry cleaners to get a stain removed. No! It's about going to meet with our Father who pardons us, who forgives us, and who rejoices."

What Pope Francis is saying here is that when going to Confession, we should not just be "going through the motions." Instead, the Sacrament of Confession should involve our heart and soul because it is a personal encounter with Christ. Remember that we priests offer the sacrament before almost every Mass. In addition, in two weeks 5-6 priests will be at St. Peter church on Palm Sunday at 3:00pm for a Penance Service. Hopefully you will plan to attend if you haven't already received the sacrament this Lent.

### EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE – BASED ON THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

HAVE you put sports, entertainment, leisure, job, money, popular opinion before God?

Is your love for the worldly things greater than your love for God?

HAVE you neglected your morning or night prayers? Have you devoted time to learning more about the Catholic Faith and then devoted time to teaching it to others, especially to your children, family, etc?

HAVE you given a bad example to others, especially to children, by what you have done or failed to do?

HAVE you used God's name in a blasphemous way? Have you taken the name of God in vain by using it as an expression when, for example, you are surprised, upset, etc?

HAVE you kept holy the Lord's Day, and all other days commanded to be kept holy, by going to Mass, setting aside extra time for prayer and spiritual reflection/study?

HAVE you kept holy the Lord's Day by abstaining from the regular daily tasks of work, shopping, cleaning, etc. so as to be able to give time to God?

HAVE you respected and obeyed your parents, teachers, and others who have legitimate authority over you? Do you rebel against and disregard the authority of God's Church?

HAVE you desired or hastened the death of anyone, including unborn children? Have you desired revenge or held a grudge against someone? Have you looked down upon anyone?

HAVE you been sexually active with someone other than the person to whom you are married? Have you inappropriately touched or looked at another person? Have you incited sexual pleasure with yourself, either mentally or physically?

HAVE you been guilty of immodest dress? Have you seen or read immodest, sexually suggestive, pornographic literature, movies, or websites? Have you been guilty of unchaste music, conversations, words, or actions?

HAVE you stolen? Have you been dishonest in dealing with others, including your employer with your time, and the government with your taxes, or your insurance company?

HAVE you borne false witness or slander another person? Have you gossiped about another person? Have you stretched the truth for your own benefit? Are you prideful?

HAVE you been envious or jealous toward others? Have you been grateful to God for the blessings He has bestowed upon you?

# **Pope Francis** speaking on importance and power of sacrament of Confession:

When Pope Francis (birth name: Jorge Bergoglio) was only seventeen years old, as he was leaving the house in the morning to spend the day with his friends, he decided to first make a visit to his parish church. When young Jorge Bergoglio arrived in the church, he met a priest that he had never seen before. The priest conveyed such a great sense of spirituality that Bergoglio decided to go to Confession to him. That sacramental encounter of Christ and the grace of sacrament greatly affected the future priest and pope. He was a practicing Catholic but this Confession awakened his faith. He said, "Something strange happened to me in that Confession. I don't know what it was, but it changed my life."

# St. John Paul II

The sacrament of reconciliation is not reserved only for those who commit serious sins. It was instituted for the remission of all sins and the grace that flows from it has a special [power] of purification and support in the effort of amendment and progress. It is an irreplaceable sacrament in the Christian life. It cannot be disregarded or neglected if one wants the seed of divine life to mature in the Christian and produce all the desired results.

#### St. Teresa of Calcutta

One thing is necessary for us — Confession. Confession is nothing but humility in action. We call it Penance, but really it is a sacrament of love, a sacrament of forgiveness... It is a place where I allow Jesus to take away from me everything that divides, that destroys. When there is a gap between me and Christ, when my love is divided, anything can come to fill the gap. We should be very simple and childlike in Confession.... Only in Confession can we go as sinners with sin and come out as sinners without sin.
