FROM THE PASTOR:



As we Ohioans are nearing a special election in just over a week (Aug. 8) and a general election this fall (Nov. 7), it is good to be reminded of the importance of being involved in politics, as much as we might not like doing so. Pope Francis said Catholics should be involved in the political discussion, and offer their prayers, so that the governing process will proceed in humility, respect, and truth.

Pope Francis rejects the idea that "a good Catholic doesn't meddle in politics." Pope Francis: "We need to participate for the common good. Sometimes we hear. a good Catholic is not interested in politics. This is not true: good Catholics immerse themselves in politics by offering the best of themselves so that the leader can govern."

Pope Francis acknowledged the tendency for people to speak only critically of their leaders, to complain about, "...things that don't go well." Instead of simply complaining, he reminds us that we should pray, since prayer is, "...the best that we can offer to those who govern." Pope Francis directs us to St. Paul's first letter to Timothy where we are directed to pray for the conversion and strong leadership of those in authority.

It's critically important that voters take the time to understand the issues and candidates on every voting ballot. The special election next week (Aug. 8) is an important one because it involves changing how our State Constitution can be amended directly by the voters. This political issue has gained unusually high attention because it will make it more difficult to pass the proposed pro-abortion amendment to the Ohio Constitution on the Nov. 7 election ballot. To be clear, Issue 1 is not a moral issue but a political issue that will affect both in future elections.

I encourage you to research the arguments for and against Issue I and decide appropriately on this *political* issue. The condensed summary of those arguments, for those who have been asking, is as follows. Those in favor of Issue I contend that the current requirement of 50.01% voters is not a clear majority but a divided electorate. They contend that at least 60% of voters should agree to change the Constitution. Those opposed contend the current requirement is fine.

Issue 1 also would require future initiative petitions proposing a constitutional amendment to be signed by at least 5% of the electors in each of Ohio's 88 counties before going to the election ballot, rather than the current requirement of 44 counties. Those opposed to the change argue it is too restrictive and those in favor contend 5% of the electorate of every county is minimal.

Pope Francis's directive that we be politically involved is not new, but is instead the clear, consistent teaching of the Church. Let us not forget his directive that we pray every day for the political process and our elected officials. Remember to always be civil in your discussions and debates.



UNIVERSAL SCHOOL CHOICE FOR ALL OHIO FAMILIES!

We are so grateful to the Ohio Legislature for their passage of Universal School Choice in the state budget. The Universal School Choice legislation is specifically designed to support Ohio families who seek the ability to proactively choose a school that aligns with their family's values and educational goals for their children. Now

every family, regardless of address or Household income, can receive some type of an EdChoice scholarship.

What does this mean for parents?

Every family in Ohio, regardless of income or address, is now eligible to apply for an EdChoice Scholarship to attend St. Peter's School. Families who make less than 450% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPV) **who live in ANY** school district will receive a full scholarship covering 100% of tuition for the upcoming school year.

Families that earn more than 450% FPV can apply to receive a pro-rated

scholarship based on income. In the past, families living outside the Mansfield City School District did not have access to scholarships unless they were considered low income. Now, everyone can the receive a scholarship for the school of their choice. See the link below for more details

In addition to universal school choice, this year's budget also provides for more funding for public school districts supporting a new school funding formula which increases base costs and perpupil categorical funding. There is also new funding for community charter schools.

If you haven't considered St. Peter's School in the past because of access to scholarships, we hope you now take a second look. Rooted in faith, St. Peter's School is a community of grace, dedicated to excellence, where every student is known, valued, and loved. Recognizing the importance of formative education, we are very excited about our new Middle School which is specifically designed to challenge, nurture and foster greatness in our emerging adolescents.

SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY (1786-1859) FEAST DAY - AUGUST 4



A busy pastor jokingly suggests the secret of John Vianney's holiness: "He died seventeen years before telephones!" Call they didn't, but visit they did, keeping Vianney eighteen hours a day in the confessional. Stories abound of reading hearts and exorcisms, but Vianney's first miracle was getting ordained. Difficulty with studies delayed him, prompting the rector's apology to the bishop, "So far to ordain just one, especially this one!" The bishop, who could not know he was ordaining the future patron saint of parish priests, replied, "No burden to ordain one good priest!" In Ars, only an elderly handful attended Mass, "praying," one told Vianney, "for a priest with brains." But he stayed fortytwo years, fulfilling the promise he made the day he arrived. In a sculpture just outside the village Vianney points skyward: "Show me the way to Ars," he tells a boy, "and I'll show you the way to heaven." To someone who feared there was no heaven beyond the grave, Vianney smiled, "My child, it would have been heaven enough to have lived as Jesus' disciple on earth." -Peter Scagnelli
