Dear Parishioners,

Christmas is just a week away. Hopefully, in the busyness of the season, you are making room in your schedule for quiet prayer and reflection. Even if it is only fifteen minutes, you will find it is one of the best times of your day. For many, this is best done very early in the morning or

late at night, since this is the time of fewest distractions. Set aside your worries and concerns for this short time and ask the Holy Spirit for guidance and inspiration. As you focus on the Christmas story, you will discover, little by little, Godly peace and joy.

To help with your preparation and celebration of this holy season, please consider attending *this Sunday afternoon* a tri-parish performance of Advent Lessons and Carols. Musicians and singers from our three parishes, and beyond, will combine the beautiful music of Christmas with the inspiring words of Sacred Scripture. The I hour performance will begin in St. Peter church at 4pm and conclude in the church basement with a lite reception. I hope to see you there for this pre-Christmas celebration of mystery, joy, and wonder.

Please look closely at the Mass schedule for the entire 3 -day Christmas weekend. The Mass times for Sunday morning will be slightly different from the normal Sunday Mass times. As I mentioned a few weeks ago, we have the opportunity (and obligation) to attend Mass twice during these three days: once for the 4th Sunday of Advent and once for Christmas. You are encouraged to arrive early for any of the Masses so that you can enjoy the beauty of sacred music before the manger scene. Make yourself available to be with Him and He will be with you.

One of those truths that we need to hear is the necessity of receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It's not the most popular sacrament, but it's one of the most important. Padre Pio said the sacrament had the power to change the course of a soul from hell to heaven. Pope Francis said the same in recalling how frequent reception of it has heavily influenced who he is today. The Blessed Virgin Mary said we should go to Confession at least every month.

We would do very well to follow the simple spiritual instructions of the Saints, who give us the most direct path to heaven. As a result, we priests make it very convenient for you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This last week of Advent, we will be offering even more opportunities for you to go to Confession beyond our regular times. Each of us priests will be present at 12 noon and 6pm according to the following schedule:

Dec. 18 Monday – St. Peter Dec. 19 Tuesday – St. Mary

Dec. 20 Wednesday – St. Peter

Dec. 21 Thursday - Resurrection

Dec. 22 Friday - St. Peter

Again, three priests will be present each of these days at both 12 noon and then again at 6pm. We will be in the church for at least one hour, or until all confessions are heard. God's blessings to you this last week of Advent! Sincerely,

Is Christmas Day a Holy Day of Obligation

Holy Days of Obligation are days Catholics should attend Mass. All Sundays and other important feast days, like Christmas, are Holy Days of Obligation. To fulfill this requirement Catholics can attend a vigil the evening before or the day of Mass.

Christmas falls on a Monday in 2023. This means that a vigil Mass on Saturday, December 23 or a morning Mass on Sunday, December 24 fulfills the Fourth Sunday of Advent obligation. A vigil Mass on Sunday, December 24 or Mass on Christmas Day fulfills the Holy Day obligation. The Mass is essential to Catholic spirituality. Holy Days of Obligation, provide chances to deepen our faith and grow in our relationship with God through worship and reflection.

From the Head of School

On December 8th, our school community celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Gathered together on this Holy Day of Obligation, our students heard the powerful Annunciation Gospel message of Mary being called to be the Mother of our Savior, Jesus Christ. This Gospel reading, Luke 1:26–38, reflects so many of the hopes and prayers we have for our students and our school.

"Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." Every day at St. Peter's School, our students are encouraged to challenge themselves, to not be afraid, and to seek the favor of God. From our Montessori preschoolers to our high school seniors, St. Peter's students are encouraged to be independent, self-directed learners, expanding their horizons, even when mastering new skills may seem a bit scary. Whether it's our advanced math class for a group of third graders or the philosophy class in our high school, St. Peter's is committed to building strong thinkers and leaders who meet new obstacles with courage, fortitude, and grace. In addition, through our structured, formative education, we hope to inspire our students to understand the importance of living lives of virtue and purpose, lives that are pleasing to God.

"For nothing will be impossible for God." The Gospel also underscores the power of God in our lives and in our school community. While many of our students are not Catholic, teaching them to recognize the power of God in their lives and in our world is foundational to our school. In this Gospel, once Mary realized that the angel was a messenger from God, she assented to His will. At St. Peter's School, our holistic education prepares our students to recognize and be attuned to the voice of God, hearing His messages, rather than the chatter of a secular and often confusing world. Moreover, as our students become more comfortable with God's call to them, they will begin to realize that, indeed, nothing is impossible for God, and with God they can do great and wondrous things.

"May it be done to me according to your word." As our students continue to hear, study, learn, and internalize the messages of God, their relationship with Him grows. As it grows, they begin to trust in the Lord and the plans that He has for each and every one of them. Our faculty and staff are committed to helping our students discern, understand, and fulfill God's specific plan for them, nurturing them to use their unique gifts and skills in ways that serve God and others. Here at St. Peter's, we strive to build servants of God, who, like Mary, are willing to answer God's call, even when it is scary or difficult.

As the Advent season continues, I hope and pray that we all find solace, wonder, and power in the Annunciation Gospel message, willingly accepting all that God calls each of us to do in our own lives. For when we hear and embrace the word of God, nothing is impossible.

- ✓ HAVE you put sports, entertainment, leisure, job, money, popular opinion before God? Is your love for the worldly things greater than your love for God? HAVE you neglected your morning or night prayers? Have you devoted time to learning more about the Catholic Faith and then devoted time to teaching it to others, especially to your children, family, etc? HAVE you given a bad example to others, especially to children, by what you have done or failed to do?
- √ HAVE you used God's name in a blasphemous way? Have you taken the name of God in vain by using it as an expression when, for example, you are surprised, upset, etc?
- HAVE you kept holy the Lord's Day, and all other days commanded to be kept holy, by going to Mass, setting aside extra time for prayer and spiritual reflection/study? HAVE you kept holy the Lord's Day by abstaining from the regular daily tasks of work, shopping, cleaning, etc. so as to be able to give time to God?
- HAVE you respected and obeyed your parents, teachers, and others who have legitimate authority over you? Do you rebel against and disregard the authority of God's Church?
- ✓ HAVE you desired or hastened the death of anyone, including unborn children? Have you desired revenge or held a grudge against someone? Have you looked down upon anyone?
- ✓ HAVE you been sexually active with someone other than the person to whom you are married? Have you inappropriately touched or looked at another person? Have you incited sexual pleasure with yourself, either mentally or physically? HAVE you been guilty of immodest dress? Have you seen or read immodest, sexually suggestive, pornographic literature, movies, or websites? Have you been guilty of unchaste music, conversations, words, or actions?
- HAVE you stolen? Have you been dishonest in dealing with others, including your employer with your time, and the government with your taxes, or your insurance company?
- ✓ HAVE you borne false witness or slander another person? Have you gossiped about another person? Have you stretched the truth for your own benefit? Are you prideful?
- ✓ HAVE you been envious or jealous toward others? Have you been grateful to God for the blessings He has bestowed upon you?
