From the Pastor:



Dear Parishioners,

God's blessing to you and your family this Christmas season. May you have the privilege of spending time with family and friends during this special time of year. May you have the even greater privilege of truly experiencing the real joy of Christmas this year – God! The

way we do this is, firstly, to take time each day to turn away from worldly distractions so that, secondly, we are able to devote quality, one-on-one time with God. Remember that God is more personal and relational than any human person – God is the fulfillment of all human desire!

The glitter on the tree, the neatly wrapped presents, and even the beautiful music is not the reason for the season. God becomes one of us in every way but sin. He experiences every human situation – work, sleep, fatigue, hunger, pain, joy, temptation, and even death so that He could lead us to something greater - Himself. In becoming man and experiencing everything we deal with each day, God seeks to eliminate the thinking that God's ways and teachings are simply suggestions, rather than commands that bring about the lasting peace and joy we desire.

A quick, honest assessment of both ourselves and the world in which we live says that we need God. We aren't able to take care of things by ourselves, and our solutions for a multitude of concerns and problems seem to be more temporary than permanent. Yes, we need God and Christmas shows us that He is with us. Emmanuel means "God is with us." But don't forget, God needs us to do something – truly follow Him. Too often we allow ourselves to be enslaved by things of the world at the great cost of not knowing who and what God really is. Let this Christmas be different! Be sure to devote time to prayer, spiritual reading, and personal reflection. This practice might seem like something only monks and scholars do rather than the ordinary person. However, throughout Christianity, both the young and old, rich and poor, educated and uneducated have made commitments to regular times of prayer each day. This is how we experience God's love, and find the strength to carry our crosses without becoming negative. Praying is how we also bring the goodness and power of God into the lives of other people, some of whom desperately need our prayerful assistance.

Christmas reminds us that each of us are wanted and loved by God. It is very comforting to know this. Sometimes we do not feel the love and compassion from other people as we should. Sometimes we might feel lonely or discouraged. In each of these cases, we turn to God. Don't ignore or be complacent of His daily invitation to you! Respond to God's with obedience, joy, and daily prayer! Anything less during this Christmas season is foolish!



Saint Nicholas Day

From the Director of Strategic Initiatives

The weeks leading up to Christmas Break are invariably busy. Amidst the backdrop of trimming trees, searching for gifts, and planning travels and festivities, our school community is preparing for the end of the semester with teachers striving to keep students engaged, as they study for finals and complete projects. During this busiest time of year, we, as a Catholic school, work equally hard to refocus our students' attention by providing opportunities for them to quiet their hearts and minds and celebrate the coming anniversary of Christ's birth and prepare for his return.

More than encountering the stories central to our faith in their religion and theology classrooms and seeing the visible symbols of Advent such as the wreaths and the nativity scenes in our buildings, our mission is for every student to live the Advent season—to experience the hope, peace, joy, and love central to this liturgical season—and grow closer as a community and closer to Christ in doing so.

In these first weeks of advent, our elementary students gather in the main hallway each Monday, praying together, singing about Christ's birth, and learning the meaning of each candle as it is lit. Simultaneously, our middle and high schoolers gather during morning meeting learning how to be Jesus to others, inspired by stories such as the one Coach Shoulders shared about how a bag of pizza rolls can make a difference—just ask any student how.

In these ways, we not only introduce them to saints—such as St. Nicholas, who visited our Montessori and elementary students, filling the shoes with oranges and candy canes and their hearts with joy—but also challenge them to live the virtues of the saints. As you read in last week's bulletin, students celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Mass, encouraging them to have the fortitude to answer God's call, no matter how much courage it takes. To use their gifts and talents, whether it is in praising God through their voices as our middle and high school choir did in their renditions of "Silent Night" and "Little Town of Bethlehem," or through the application of their knowledge in service to our community, in service to the world.

Across campus, students have been practicing these corporal works of mercy—collecting items for the homeless, organizing them, and compiling blessing bags for those, like Mary and Joseph, seeking shelter this holiday season. In acts of empathy and grace, they've written cards of gratitude to first responders and hospital workers, cards of peace and love to those away from their families during this holiday season, as well as letters of hope for those attending our prisonministry retreat.

In addition to bringing peace to others, we encourage them to find peace within themselves, inviting students in grades 3-12 to Friday confession to help them prepare their hearts for the full joy of Christmas. Second graders, Claire Berry, Maxine Cavanaugh, Gavin Faulk, Cambrie O'Neil, and Henry Richlovsky, who recently celebrated their First Reconciliation, are excited to join them.



CATHOLIC WOMEN'S CLUB


